Message from Dawn

Easter – not Christmas – is the most important of our Christian festivals. It celebrates the heart of the Gospel (God's good news) that because Jesus died and rose again, we can be set free to enjoy new life with God. The symbol 'X' is sometimes used to mark a crossroads. The cross of Christ is like a crossing where the perfection of heaven cuts through the rubbish in our lives, cancelling out and removing all that we've done wrong. This particular 'X' marks the spot where God intervenes and offers us the wholesome, satisfying fullness of life that he longs for us to enjoy. Many people use an 'X' after their name in a letter (remember them?) or a card to signify a kiss, meaning that their message is sent with their love. You can see the cross of Jesus like this too – the most powerful message, sent with infinite love. One of my favourite hymns about the cross contains these words:

> On the mount of crucifixion, fountains opened deep and wide; through the floodgates of God's mercy flowed a vast and gracious tide. Grace and love like mighty rivers, poured incessant from above, and heaven's peace and perfect justice kissed a guilty world in love.
