Plan for Shotesham Christmas and Festive celebrations.

Alongside national campaigns, the SVA is hoping to encourage our friends and neighbours in Shotesham to help us to brighten up our Festive Season and celebrate Christmas. Everything will of course depend on restrictions in place at the time, but we are planning a few events at least some of which can **hopefully** go ahead.

Whether lockdown ends or not, we can all help to brighten December in Shotesham with Christmas lights etc in our gardens. Many of us do this already but, with the lockdown due to end at midnight on 2nd December, we're hoping as many people as possible will **light up on 3rd December**, with a coordinated village switch on at 6pm for those who want to take part.

The Christmas trees at All Saints and St Mary's Churches will also be in place early to coincide with this, and children (all ages!) of Shotesham are invited to make decorations and place them on one or both trees. Christine Burton is hoping to have a workshop for kids to make tree decorations from natural materials on **Sunday 13th at Hillside.**

Following our successful children's Hallowe'en letter hunt, we're hoping to organise a similar Christmas themed competition, and there will also be a visit from **Santa who will ride through Shotesham in his sleigh on the evening of 21st or 22nd Dec,** perhaps with a small gift for any children who come out to see him. Final possible Christmas event(and this will most definitely be dependant on restrictions) we are hoping to have an event to coincide with with the National Carol singalong on 20th December at 5.30pm. Unfortunately, we have to apologise to our many friends from surrounding areas who normally join us as we will have to limit this to **Shotesham residents only**, and even

then it will be reduced numbers similar to our Remembrance Sunday event in November. The idea for this will be for people to take a Candlelit walk from their own home, or at least away from All Saints as no parking will be available, and gather socially distanced on Church Hill just before 5.30 for a short carol service. We would hope to take a collection at this and the Santa event with proceeds going to a local charity.

And finally, finally, it is intended to have our **New Years Eve, 5 mile Shotesham Fun Run**. A fun event for runners of any age and ability for families and friends of Shotesham. The race will start and finish on All Saints Hill and participants are asked to come along at **10.45** to sign in for an 11am start. However, recognising some probable restrictions, we may have to take steps to avoid crowding, perhaps with staggered starts etc. If you intend to give it a go, please contact ken at resotan@aol.com so we can manage the numbers.
