Thought from Dawn

I inadvertently upset someone recently by mentioning that although we celebrate the birth of Jesus on 25^{th} December, we don't actually know on what day he was born – and it's highly unlikely to have been in December at all.

Some of the beliefs we have about Christmas have been 'handed down' to us, or gleaned from various other sources.... Christmas carols for example. *We three kings*.... the Bible doesn't say how many there were and doesn't describe them as kings. *Little donkey*.... it's possible that Mary rode a donkey to Bethlehem but the Bible doesn't give us that information. Here's another one:

Silent night, holy night, all is calm, all is bright....

A holy night, without doubt. But hardly silent. Bethlehem was filled to bursting with visitors obliged to come and register for the census. There was no "calm" in all of Israel – only tension and conflict between the Jewish people and the Roman occupiers. Hardly a place of '*heavenly peace*' it was a land torn apart by oppression, persecution, and terror. *All is bright*? The darkness of fear gripped the people...

Yet on such a night, the light of the world – Jesus – was born, bringing real hope and the power to transform lives of pain and brokenness with lasting joy. In the middle of our own dark nights of pain and anguish, God comes and transforms them into 'holy' nights of his peace.

May you carry his gift of peace with you throughout the coming year. Blessings
