Thought from Dawn

'Let it snow!'

It seems snow may well be on the way. Welcomed by some and dreaded by others. The first time I saw Shotesham All Saints – many years ago – I was told of how amazing it looked with a thick covering of snow – and how the hillside was ideal for sledging! That winter an excessively heavy snowfall covered the landscape in a duvet of sparkling crystal. It looked stunning! I haven't seen snow quite like that since. The wonders of magnification allow us to see the intricate beauty of a snowflake. Each one unique – a mindboggling number of variations. We marvel at the work of the Creator ... A single snowflake has very little staying power. It's easily brushed off the back of our hand. It melts quickly on our lips. Yet enough of them together in one place can form a snowdrift capable of stopping traffic. Together they remain intact for days, even years at a time.

The principle of finding strength in unity can be applied to many situations of course. But it's an excellent illustration of the advantages of community for those who follow Jesus. If as Christians we spend too much time isolated from other Christians then we're in danger of making ourselves as vulnerable and fragile as a single snowflake. But strengthened and encouraged by the community of faith – the church – we can make a difference – and be equipped with staying power.

Circumstances may prevent you from attending worship every week but I encourage you – whether you're 'just exploring' or wanting to 'go deeper' to remain connected to your local congregation – church or chapel, we worship the same God!
