### Thought from Dawn

Easter is early this year, so Shrove Tuesday (pancake alert!) is on 13<sup>th</sup> February. The following day, Ash Wednesday, marks the beginning of Lent – traditionally a season of fasting during which we are encouraged to review our spiritual health and perhaps to give something up – in order to release extra time for prayer or some other spiritual discipline.
