There was great excitement in the parish a few days ago when a new Bishop of Thetford was announced. His role is to assist the Bishop of Norwich and part of this involves being our local area Bishop. The post is to go to the current Archdeacon of Macclesfield who many of you may remember as Ian Bishop – one time vicar of Shotesham and the other parishes in our group.

Although I've never met Ian, I'm also delighted at this appointment because over the years I've heard quite a bit about him from those who know him and who very much appreciated his ministry here.

The news prompted one of those slightly silly conversations about having a 'Bishop Bishop'. I pointed out that it is more usual to address a Bishop using his Christian name after his title, as in 'Bishop Ian' rather than 'Bishop Bishop.' Which then led me to muse on how that will feel for Ian.... perhaps a little like I'd feel if people suddenly started calling me 'Davidson Dawn'....!!

Ian will be ordained as bishop in Westminster Abbey on 29<sup>th</sup> September and there is to be a service of welcome for him and his wife, Sue, in Norwich Cathedral on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> September at 17.30 pm– to which all are warmly invited.

**Please be aware,** it appears we have a fair bit of Hemlock in the village in areas such as the Common, Church Hill & Joy's Loke, this plant is dangerously toxic and should be avoided. Unfortunately it looks very similar to Cow Parsley but can be identified by red splotches on the stems, some good info and photos on the Norwich City Council website -
