**March 2015**

Easter is early this year and so by the time you read this we will already be a few days into Lent. Lent is to Easter what Advent is to Christmas - a season of preparation and anticipation. In particular, Lent is a time to prayerfully reflect on how we're doing spiritually. For those who take seriously the discipline of Lent it is an opportunity for a kind of spiritual spring-cleaning, sometimes involving the practice of fasting – giving something up – so that more time can be given to prayer. It may be food - chocolate seems to have become the popular option (perhaps in anticipation of the large amount of Easter eggs shortly to be consumed!) Some choose to go without their social media during Lent. Now there's a challenge for many of us! How dependent we've become on our 'hand held devices'.... if only we were so dependent on God!

We can use Lent to focus on growing in a specific area of faith, or to renew and refresh a faith that has fallen on dry times. Traditionally, at this time of year, people new to Christianity would be prepared for their baptism which would take place at Easter. So Lent is both a time of preparation and a time to return to God.

There are so many helps available to those wanting to explore or renew their faith – books, courses, Christian TV and radio channels, daily devotional material and a wealth of on-line resources. Some care and guidance is needed when looking at what's on offer as not all of it is helpful. Then of course, there is the local church. Do be in touch with me if you'd like further details of services or help with resources you can use at home.

Meanwhile, have a meaningful and blessed Lent.
