### Thought from Dawn

Apart from the obvious benefits of physical exercise, a walk in the country is often beneficial to our mental state as well – calming and relaxing an over-active agitated mind and many times helping us to see things in their true perspective. I'm convinced that this is because going into 'the big outdoors' enables us to put useful distance between ourselves and whatever it is that may be bothering us.

Plus we simply cannot physically carry a lot of clutter when we go for a walk – the nature of the exercise forces us to 'travel light'.

This is one reason why holidays and retreats are so beneficial – it's because we have (at least temporarily) left most of our 'stuff' behind. The burden of responsibility fades into the background and we are free to enjoy life without its accumulated clutter.

Used wisely, the season of Lent can have a similar effect on us spiritually. It allows us to purge ourselves of the accumulated mental and spiritual clutter that has built up over the past months.

So it becomes a kind of 'spring-clean for the spirit'.

If you are someone who fasts during Lent, it doesn't have to be about giving up particular foods. We can also fast from shopping, from technology (now there's challenge, give up the hand held gadgets for 40 days!), from driving – well you get the idea – there are creative ways to abstain from something in order to create quality time to renew your spirit, recharge your inner life and connect with the God who loves you.
