What a joy it was to celebrate Easter sans restrictions; no masks, no socially distanced seating, a real 'in-person' encounter with all who joined our church services and village outdoor activities. Some were away on holiday, others were hosting visiting family members – all rediscovering our freedom and reconnecting with community.

In a recent conversation someone described how they were struggling with stress and a feeling of 'not belonging' in the workplace. This person is deeply attracted to the community offered by God's family – the church – and is exploring how this might help to build their resilience for what they have to deal with during their working week.

As we prepare to welcome families from Ukraine, may we continue to work together to discover and share more of the joys of being community.
