To mark this year's particularly significant Remembrance Day, the service in All Saints will begin at the earlier time of 9:30am and will include some very moving poetry and readings originally written by pupils at Framingham High School for the rededication of Shotesham's War Memorial in 2010.

The service leads on to the traditional gathering around the War Memorial, following which, the Parish Council kindly invite all to the Trinity for refreshments and to view an exhibition on the First World War - with a distinctly local focus.

Although the 11th is set as Remembrance Day for historical reasons, the theme fits well with the season of the year. The weather grows colder, darkness falls at an earlier hour and all of nature begins its fall into slumber for the winter.

Autumn is achingly beautiful and behind its blaze of colour fading into the grey stillness of winter, lies the promise of Spring. There are parallels with the Christian faith, which holds on to the promise of resurrection. Many who fought for king and country did so with that hope in their hearts. The Remembrance Weekend...10th to 11th November

As is traditional, the Remembrance Day ceremony will take place on Church Hill on Remembrance Sunday, 11th of November, at 10.45am for the 11am 'silence', as we remember those who gave their lives for us in World Wars One and Two.

Please note, this year **the church service in All Saints will be at 9.30am** and will end to allow attendance on Church Hill.

If you have a family member who is remembered on another memorial, you can remember them on Sunday by placing a cross alongside those in place on the memorial.

Alongside the service and ceremony there will be an exhibition at the Trinity. It will be open on Saturday and Sunday between 10am and 6pm.

For 100 years the whole country, and thus Shotesham, has recognised the ultimate sacrifice 'The Men of Shotesham' made to keep us safe. The exhibition at the Trinity will, for the first time, recognise the many villagers who went to war between 1914 and 1918 and thankfully returned.

They saw and did things we can only imagine. Call in and see who they their families were, where they lived, and where they fought.

On Sunday, tea/coffee will be served at the Trinity at 11.15am to allow the exhibition to be viewed following the ceremony on Church Hill.
