Thought from Dawn

If you asked most people whether they had been missing the petrichor over recent weeks, I daresay you'd get a few blank looks. The petrichor is something that is quite familiar to most of us. We would easily recognise it and yet the majority would be hard pressed to give it a name....

I often wonder how many people recognise the presence of God and yet fail to name that presence – and therefore fail to identify God? Most people I talk to (even those who tell me they have no faith) describe circumstances, situations, conversations and so on where - it is very clear to me – God is present. Often what such people describe as 'coincidence' I may identify as a 'God-incidence'. Something they see as 'lucky' I may regard as God's blessing. It stands to reason that we are likely to 'miss' God if we're not looking for him in the first place.

Until just a few hours before I sat down to write this, we had all missed something that is very familiar to most of us — the petrichor. This is the name given to "a pleasant smell that frequently accompanies the first rain after a long period of warm dry weather".

Thankfully God (unlike the petrichor) is ever-present, whether or not we recognise him.... but when we choose to look for him and begin to identify his presence, we experience a refreshing that beats anything rain or the petrichor can offer!

Visit to Stoke Radar Station - 11am Saturday 1st October

The 'radio' masts in Upper Stoke are well-known to us all. This was originally the site of one of the 21 Radar Stations that were built just before the Second World War, in a chain running from Orkney to Hampshire. However, you may not know that in a nearby garden there are other remains of the Radar Station including the impressive concrete shell of the operations room, a pill box and a Guard Room, with an exhibition that has been curated by Derek Bales.
