Happy New Year from all at South Norfolk, I hope you all enjoyed your Christmas and New Year.

Since the turn of the New Year, local officers have conducted a multi-agency day of action, alongside licensing, environmental health and council officials. This was a successful operation with a number of offences being disclosed and dealt with by the relevant agency.

Officers have also been conducted speed checks and dealing a number of traffic related offences, particularly around the 'Fatal 4'-drink/drug driving, speeding, mobile phone offences and seatbelt offences. As the colder weather is here, please ensure you adjust your driving accordingly, ensuring your vehicle is safe for the conditions.

## Crime Updates

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Business and community	0	Thefts committed in shops, businesses and other property
Burglary - Residential	1	Entry to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and garages
Criminal Damage	1	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	0	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	0	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
