## Message from Inspector Andrew

I am settling into my new role and understand community concerns around speeding. We have been presenting to local communities across South Norfolk explaining that police cannot tackle this problem alone. My teams will maintain focus on 5 key locations across each beat where we believe there is greatest risk. As an organisation we must balance our response along with other operational policing requirements. I would like to offer an opportunity to members of the local community to become actively involved in supporting us in tackling speeding. You can do this by being part of community speed watch. Our engagement officer PC Jim Squires is keen to hear from anyone willing to support us in helping you. Community Speed Watch costs nothing to set up and we will train and insure its members. Last month our groups detected 44 speeding offences. If you are interested in setting up a group please let me know.

## Crime Updates

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Business and community	0	Thefts committed in shops, businesses and other property
Burglary - Residential	1	Entry to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and garages
Criminal Damage	0	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	1	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	0	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.

We have in the past had vehicles stolen when owners have gone out on a cold winter's morning and left the engine running to de-ice/warm the car on the drive way before they need to leave.

'January was another busy month for Poringland SNT - from dealing with treacherous weather conditions, traffic enforcement, and continuing to tackle ASB and criminal activity.

In terms of traffic enforcement during a single shift last week, a team of Police Specials assisted us by issuing five Traffic Offence Reports for speeding, using a mobile phone whilst driving and not using a seatbelt. A further 28 motorists were given Words of Advice about the manner of their driving.

Along the lines of road safety, we have already visited a number of primary schools during this term, and spoken with children about the dangers of the road, who to contact in an emergency, and given them the opportunity to look around our marked police cars.
