## Message from Dawn

The recent Friday night storm left quite a bit of debris on local roads – a curiously similar mix of sandy soil and pebbles washed off surrounding verges. It had me reflecting on how the storms of life can cause all sorts of detritus to surface in our own lives. Under pressure we realise (often with a certain sense of shock) that we are perhaps not as 'together' as we thought. Sandy soil also reminds us of the parable Jesus tells about two men, each of whom built a house. One chose to dig down deep and laid a foundation on solid rock, the other opted for sandy soil. When the storm hit, the house on the rock stood firm, while the house on the sand collapsed and was destroyed. Those who build their lives on the solid foundation of Jesus' word, his teaching and example, will withstand the storms of life. A solid faith carries us through.
